FINDINGS OF FACT

Respondent knew, or should have known that she was required to complete 10 hours of continuing competency for the 2018-2020 compliance period.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The conduct and circumstances as stated in the above Findings of Fact constitute a violation of A.R.S. §32-2022(24) “Failing to complete continuing competence requirements as established by the board by rule.”

ORDER

Probation: The Arizona State Board of Physical Therapy hereby orders that Respondent, holder of Certificate No. PTA-013935, be placed on probation for a period of six (6) months to commence upon the effective date of this Order with the possibility of early termination. Failure to comply with the terms of probation shall be subject to the Noncompliance term of the Order. The Board orders Respondent to comply with the following terms and conditions of probation:

Civil Penalty: Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of \$150.00 dollars.

Jurisprudence Exam: Respondent shall take and pass the Arizona Jurisprudence Examination (AZ Law).

Continuing Education: Respondent shall take and complete continuing education in the areas listed below within six (6) months from the effective date of this order. Respondent must submit to Board staff for approval prior to beginning the continuing education courses, a syllabus of each course. Respondent shall provide documentation to Board staff that the course was completed prior to any termination of probation is considered.

- a. Respondent shall take and complete a minimum of six (6) hours of continuing education in the area of **Ethics**.

2) Case No 20-06; Todd Holland, PT (9 am)

Respondent holds License No. LPT-007351 to practice as a physical therapist in the State of Arizona.

The Board initiated case number 20-06 after receiving information that alleged that Respondent engaged in substandard care, created inaccurate documentation and improperly billed for services.

Respondent billed for documentation time under direct patient care CPT codes as a way to boost his productivity.

Respondent billed for services that were not provided for EG. Respondent also incorrectly billed for direct care services for SS and JB.

Respondent affirmed that he understood that he created a false record when he billed his services for SS, EG and JB.

Respondent billed EG on 1/29/20 when he did not assess/provide treatment on that day.

Respondent reports that he completed a re-evaluation on EG when he did not perform the examination.

A.R.S. § 32-2044(12) “Failing to adhere to the recognized standards of ethics of the physical therapy profession.”

- a. Principle 2: A physical therapist shall act in a trustworthy manner toward patients/clients and in other aspects of physical therapy practice.

A.R.S. § 32-2044(13) “Charging unreasonable or fraudulent fees for services performed or not performed.”

A.R.S. § 32-2044(14) “Making misleading, deceptive, untrue or fraudulent representations in violation of this chapter or in the practice of the profession.”

The Board discussed possible disciplinary action against Mr. Holland license. Following discussion Dr. King moved the Board adopt the following Order:

Probation: The Board hereby orders that Respondent, holder of License No. LPT-007351, is placed on probation for six (6) months. The probation may be extended or other enforcement actions taken in the event Respondent is found in violation of this Order or violates the Arizona Physical Therapy Practice Act. Respondent may petition the Board for early termination of

probation if the Board determines all requirements of the Order have been met. The Board orders Respondent to comply with the following terms and conditions:

Continuing Education: Respondent shall take and complete continuing education in the areas listed below within six (6) months from the effective date of this Order. Respondent must submit to Board staff for approval prior to beginning the continuing education courses, a syllabus of each course. Respondent shall provide documentation to Board staff that the course was completed prior to any termination of probation is considered.

- a. Respondent shall take and complete a minimum of six (6) hours of continuing education in the area of **Ethics**. Course can be completed on-line.

Jurisprudence Exam: Respondent shall take and pass the Arizona Jurisprudence Examination (AZ Law) within six (6) months from the effective date of this order.

Monitoring: Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall enter into an agreement with a neutral and objective Board-approved monitor (Monitor) and shall submit a copy of the agreement to the Monitor. The Monitor shall provide monitoring services such as those offered by Affiliated Monitors headquartered in Boston, Massachusetts. The Monitor shall not be owned by or employ any person who (a) is related to Respondent by blood or marriage, (b) has had a social or professional relationship with Respondent prior to the execution of this order, (c) receives compensation of any nature from Respondent except payment for monitoring services, or (d) otherwise has a conflict-of-interest as determined by the Board.

The Monitor's recommendations for monitoring of Respondent shall be unilaterally incorporated into this Order and Respondent shall promptly comply with any recommendations that the Monitor states in writing. Should the Monitor make recommendations to change Respondent's practice activities, the change will take place within ten (10) days of notice of the recommendation. Respondent may protest the recommendations to the Board; however, such protest must be submitted

to the Board, in writing, within ten (10) days of notice of the recommendations. The Board will determine if the recommendations should be implemented. If Respondent fails to implement the recommended changes or file a protest with the Board within ten (10) days, Respondent may be found in violation of the Board Order.

Respondent shall cause the Monitor to send monthly reports of Respondent’s compliance with this Order and the Monitor’s recommendations to the Board, which must be received by the Board by the 10th of each month.

If Respondent fails to contact and enter into an agreement with a Monitor within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this Order, the Board may determine that Respondent has violated this Order and may take additional disciplinary action.

At a minimum, monitoring of Respondent shall include the following:

A. Notification of Employment/Practice Restriction: Within five (5) calendar days of Respondent’s date of any hire to perform physical therapy services, Respondent must notify the Board in writing of the name and address of his employer.

B. Documentation Review: During the first three months of probation, the Monitor shall review Respondent’s charts and billing records on a monthly basis. At a minimum the Monitor shall review at least three charts per month. The purpose of the review is to assess compliance with the Board’s statutes and rules regarding billing and coding, age of patients provided treatment, documentation and supervision and medical services. After the Monitor has completed three months of chart reviews and the evidence shows that Respondent is in compliance with the Board’s statutes and rules, Respondent may petition the Board for early termination if all other requirements have been completed.

C) Review, Discussion and Possible Action for Initial Review:

2) Case No. 20-11; S Alexis Anderson, PT

Ms. Richardson provided a summary of the case for the Board. SC alleges that Mr. Alex Anderson, PT delegated care to a PTA, Zachary Maes, who was not qualified to perform manipulation of her right foot/ankle and subsequently was injured. She states that her involved right foot and ankle area became swollen, painful and bruised after Mr. Maes manipulated her right foot on 5/11/20. She states that she received similar treatment by Mr. Maes to her uninvolved left foot and ankle on 5/8/20 which also resulted in increased pain, swelling and bruising. She also alleges that Mr. Anderson, PT did not inform SC that Mr. Maes was not experienced and proficient in manual manipulation and did not ask her permission to have Mr. Maes “practice on me.” Finally, she alleges that the documentation of her Physical Therapy care by Alex Anderson, PT is incomplete and inaccurate.

Mr. Anderson was present and was represented by Mr. Andrew Rosenzweig.

Mr. Anderson, Mr. Rosenzweig, attorney and Ms. SC, patient all provided an opening statement to the Board.

The Board reviewed, discussed the case, and asked questions of Mr. Anderson.

Mr. Rosenzweig, attorney and Ms. SC, patient both provided a closing statement.

Dr. Cornwall moved the Board to forward the case to an **Informal Hearing** and include A.R.S. § 32-2044(14)(15)(20)(22). Mr. Clinton seconded the motion. Following review and discussion the motion **failed** by roll call.
