A) Review, Discussion and Possible Action on Formal Hearing in the following case: (10:00 a.m.)

1) Case No. 18-38; Jordan Williams, PT

Mr. Williams was present and was represented by Adam Zickerman. Mr. Williams and his attorney Mr. Zickerman introduced themselves.

Dr. Cornwall called the formal hearing to order. The Board members and Board staff introduced themselves. Dr. Cornwall provided a review of the proceedings and possible outcomes. All Board members had been furnished with copies of the Complaint and Notice of Hearing. Mr. John Tellier, Assistant Attorney General representing the State of Arizona. Ms. Elizabeth Campbell, Assistant Attorney General, was there to advise the Board.

Dr. Donahue, Ms. Richardson and Mr. Williams were sworn-in as witnesses. Mr. John Tellier, Assistant Attorney General provided an opening statement. Mr. Zickerman provided an opening statement.

Mr. Tellier entered Exhibits 1 through 3 into evidence. The Board accepted the Exhibits.

Ms. Richardson provided testimony and reviewed process by which the respondent was served with the Notice of Hearing. Mr. Tellier went over Exhibits 1 through 3.

The state rested.

Mr. Zickerman called Mr. Williams to testify and entered Exhibits packet 1 into evidence. The Board accepted the Exhibit. The state cross examined Mr. Williams and the Board asked additional questions of Mr. Williams.

The Mr. Tellier representing the State provide a closing statement. Mr. Zickerman also provided a closing statement.

The Board reviewed and discussed the case. Following review and discussion Mr. Greer moved the Board accept Allegations 1 through 23 as Findings of Fact.

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On or about November 19, 2018, a complaint was opened by the Board after receiving four (4) complaints concerning allegations regarding engaging in sexual misconduct.

2. After receipt of notification of the Board complaint, Respondent filed a written response received on December 19, 2018

3. Respondent, in his response, stated “the student is instructed to go into a room and remove the bra if they are comfortable and get into a gown or cover with a shirt.”

4. Respondent, in his response, stated that “if I am palpating ribs or sternum, I never move the gown but ask them “if you are comfortable I will have you lift up toe gown.”

5. Respondent, in his response, stated “at no time was MH exposed, but a bra can inhibit a deeper breath when practicing deep breathing, so she was asked to unhook it under the gown.”

6. Respondent, in his interview, admitted that 1-2 female patients had exposed their unclothed breasts in direct view of Respondent during an assessment of sternal excursion.

7. Patient LT engaged in an initial evaluation by Respondent on May 16, 2018 in which LT indicated the reason for the visit was due to lumbar pain with radicular symptoms into the right LE.

8. Respondent failed to document pain in the thoracic rib region subjectively. Respondent documented assessment of breathing at rest. Respondent's rationale regarding the relevance of assessing rib/thoracic /sternal excursion or breathing were not documented.

9. Responded confirmed in his interview that patient LT was one of the patients whose unclothed breasts were exposed during an assessment of sternal excursion.

10. Complainant MH confirmed, in both her written complaint and interview, that patient LT was one of the patients whose breasts were exposed during the initial evaluation conducted by the Respondent.

11. Respondent failed to appropriately drape patient LT resulting in exposure of her unclothed breasts.

12. Complainants MH and MC confirm in their interview and/or written complaint that Respondent failed to appropriately drape female patients, female volunteers and female students who were requested to remove underclothing in order to receive kinesiotaping procedures.

13. Complainants MH, MC and PG confirm in their interview and/or written complaints that each individual was requested by Respondent to remove undergarments in order to apply kinesiotape to hip or shoulder regions of the body.

14. Respondent, in his interview, confirmed that he routinely requested that patients/students/volunteers remove under garments during evaluations and with use of kinesiotape.

15. Complainants MH, MC, and PG each stated in their interview that Respondent created an environment whereby they did not feel that they could decline to remove their under garments and /or participate in kinesiotaping of the upper back or hip region.

16. SA, a former employee for Respondent, confirms that neither he, or the other two male volunteers, were ever requested to remove under garments or experience kinesiotaping.

17. SA, a former employee for Respondent, confirmed that he observed that female volunteers were taped frequently.

18. PG, in her interview, confirmed that Respondent requested that she remove undergarments on four (4) occasions in order to show her therapy techniques or engage in kinesiotaping procedure.

- a. First incident: Respondent asked PG to remove her shirt and bra, put on a gown with the opening in the back. She is asked to roll her shoulders forward and back after receiving kinesiotape.
- b. Second incident: Respondent asked PG if she wanted to experience how to facilitate breathing techniques. Respondent asked her to remove her shirt and bra. Respondent then asked her to lift her shirt.
- c. Third incident: Respondent was requested to remove her shirt and bra and wear a gown while Respondent applied kinesiotape to her upper back. Respondent then asked PG to move her arms up/down and in front.
- d. Forth incident: Respondent requested to apply kinesiotape to the front of her hips. Respondent asked PG to remove her pants, undergarments and shirt and put on a gown. Respondent moved the gown without consent up toward her head when she was laying supine, exposing her crotch.

19. MC in her written statement and interview confirmed that Respondent had a full view of her unclothed breasts and groin area during educational sessions of kinesiotaping while she was a volunteer. Respondent confirmed in his interview that he did apply kinesiotape to MC’s back and hips when she was a volunteer.

20. Respondent used disparaging comments regarding MH, stating to employee SA “that MH needed to be reminded to quit rubbing her boobs in patient’s faces.”

21. Respondent confirmed that he has no formal training in PRI (Postural Restoration Institute) to assess breathing patterns, rib excursion or sternal movements.

22. Respondent confirmed that he has no formal training in kinesiotaping procedures.

23. Respondent confirms that he chose the region of the body when applying kinesiotape to volunteers and students.

Ms. Hunter seconded the motion. Following review and discussion, the motion carried unanimously by roll call.

Dr. Cornwall moved the Board to accept as Conclusions of Law, the allegations of unprofessional conduct which include violations below:

1. The conduct and circumstances described in the findings of fact above constitute grounds for disciplinary action for violation of A.R.S. §32-2044(1) “Violating this chapter, Board rules or a written board order.”

2. The conduct and circumstances described in the findings of fact above constitute grounds for disciplinary action for violation of A.R.S. §32-2044 (10)(C) “Engaging in sexual misconduct. Intentionally viewing a completely or partially disrobed patient in the course of treatment if the viewing is not related to patient diagnosis or treatment under current practice standards.”

3. The conduct and circumstances described in the factual allegations above constitute grounds for disciplinary action for violation of A.R.S. §32-2044(12) “Failing to adhere to the recognized standards of ethics of the physical therapy profession.” 1.1(C) “A physical therapist shall not engage in any sexual relationship or activity, whether consensual or non-consensual, with any patient while a physical therapist/patient relation exists. 4.1(D) “A physical therapist shall exercise sound professional judgement based upon his/her knowledge, skill, education, training and experience.” 6.1(A) “A physical therapist’s practice shall be consistent with accepted professional standards. A physical therapist shall continuously engage in assessment activities to determine compliance with these standards.” 6.3(B) “A physical therapist participating in the educational process is responsible to the students, the academic institutions and the clinical settings for promoting ethical conduct. A physical therapist shall model behavior and provide the student with information about the Code of Ethics, opportunities to discuss ethical conflicts, and procedures for reporting unresolved ethical conflicts.” 9.1(B) “A physical therapist shall not engage in any conduct

that is unethical, incompetent or illegal.” 11.2(A) “A physical therapist shall not disparage colleagues and other health care professionals.”

**ORDER**

Ms. Hunter moved the Board imposes the following Order:

**Probation:** The Arizona Board of Physical Therapy hereby orders that Respondent, holder of Physical Therapy License No. LPT-010915, is placed on probation for **five (5) years** from the effective date of the order. The Board orders Respondent to comply with the following terms and conditions:

**Continuing Education:** Respondent shall take and complete a minimum of sixteen (16) hours of continuing education in the area of **Spine Examination and treatment** within 2 years.

**Restricted License:** Effective on the effective date of this order, respondent’s licensee to work as a physical therapist in the State of Arizona is restricted. During the period of probation listed below, Respondent **shall not:**

- a. Provide treatment to female patients without another staff female in the room at all times.
- b. Mentor or accept any students for clinical rotations or volunteers working within the clinic.

**Professional Ethics Course:** Respondent shall successfully complete the ProBe Ethics & Boundaries Course program offered by the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians (“ProBe”) or the Medical Ethics & Professionalism Physical Therapist Edition (22 hour) offered by Professional Boundaries Inc. (“PBI”) upon recommendation by the Counsellor and prior to the lifting of the suspension. Respondent shall inform the Board in writing within 10 business days of his course registration. Respondent shall submit evidence of completion within 10 business days of his successful completion of the course. Respondent shall successfully complete the ProBe or PBI Ethics program prior to the Board’s consideration of lifting the stay of suspension.

**Monitoring:** Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall enter into an agreement with a neutral and objective Board-approved monitor (“Monitor”) and shall submit a copy of the agreement to the Monitor. The Monitor shall provide monitoring services such as those offered by Arizona Professional Monitoring, headquartered in Scottsdale, Arizona or Affiliated Monitors headquartered in Boston, Massachusetts. At a minimum, monitoring of Respondent shall include the following:

A. Notification of Employment/Practice Restriction: Within five (5) calendar days of Respondent’s date of any hire to perform physical therapy services, Respondent must notify the Board in writing of the name and address of his employer. B. Clinic Review: During a minimum of the first two (2) years of probation, the Monitor shall review on a quarterly basis that the respondent is maintaining established practice restrictions and completes all board order requirements. After the Monitor has completed a minimum of two (2) years of review and the evidence shows that Respondent is in compliance with the Board’s statutes and rules, the Respondent may petition the Board to allow for request for early termination of monitoring services.

**Civil Penalty:** Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of \$5000.00 dollars. Payment may be made over the course of the 5-year probation.

**Early Termination of Probation:** It shall be Respondent’s affirmative duty to seek termination of probation ordered herein. After a minimum of two (2) years, Respondent may petition the Board for termination of his probation provided he has completed or complied with the above paragraphs. Upon receiving Respondent’s petition, the Board shall have sole discretion to determine whether Respondent has complied with all the terms and conditions of the Order prior to granting petition for early termination.
