Proposed Rules Revision

If there is one thing that can be counted on, it would be that change is inevitable. In August of 2000, sweeping changes were made to the Arizona Board of Physical Therapy's administrative rules as a result of dramatic statutory revisions adopted by the Arizona Legislature in 1998. Now, after 2 years of enforcing these administrative rules, the Board recently voted to open a rule-making docket for purposes of announcing its intention to make revisions to those rules.

The Arizona Administrative Code, or "administrative rules", co-exist with the Arizona Revised Statutes to comprise Arizona administrative law. The sections of the Code that pertain to the Arizona Board of Physical Therapy are found at Title 4, Chapter 24, Articles 1 through 5. Promulgation of rules, or "rule-making" as the process is commonly known, is a routine – and yet intricate – process, by which rules are abolished, added, amended or otherwise revised. The Board has identified a number of rules that are unclear, unnecessary, incomplete, contradictory or otherwise problematic which are in need of revision. While many of the intended revisions are technical in nature, others require more substantive changes.

Article 1, General Provisions, will be revised to include language that is more clear, concise and consistent with Board statutes. Look for additional definitions to be added to R4-24-101 and minor revisions made to the sections addressing responsibilities of Board members.

The Board's primary focus is on Article 2, Licensing and Examination Provisions. Many changes will be proposed to the

foreign-educated application requirements for Arizona licensure, and the Article will likely undergo a significant restructuring as well. This Article identifies licensure and certification renewal requirements, and potential changes to these sections will likely be of interest to licensees and certificate holders.

Technical changes are also possible for Article 3, Regulation of Physical Therapy. This is perhaps the portion of Board rules in which most licensees and certificate holders will be interested as the rule-making process is underway. In the upcoming weeks, the Board anticipates receiving and considering recommendations for changes to Article 4, Continuing Competence as well.

Now is the time for Arizona licensed physical therapists and physical therapist assistants to consider submitting Written Criticisms of Rule to the Board to offer suggestions for changes to the rules; the process for this is outlined in Article 5. According to the rule, the Board must consider any Written Criticism of Rule during the promulgation process, but is not obligated to make the requested or suggested change.

The Board intends to use this newsletter and the Board's web-site as a resource for licensees and certificate holders who are interested in following this process. The Board will hold at least one public hearing during which oral comments to the proposed changes will be collected, and the rule-making effort will be a standing agenda item for discussion during the next several public meetings of the Board. Finally, inquiries can always be made directly to Board staff members who are happy to report on the progress of the rule-making effort, as well as answer questions about the process.

Arizona Board of PT on the Web

In May of 2002, the Arizona Board of Physical Therapy finally realized a long-established goal: creation and implementation of an informative Internet site for use by the public, by policy-makers, by Arizona licensed physical therapists and certified physical therapist assistants, and by individuals interested in making application for licensure and certification in Arizona. The URL for the web-site is www.ptboard.state.az.us.



Due to limited financial resources, the responsibility for development of the site falls almost entirely with the Board staff. All of the site content is written by the staff with guidance and feedback coming from the Board. For purposes of uploading the site to the State of Arizona's server, the Board contracts with a web-master who works with a number of other state regulatory agencies.

The pages within the site are focused on the following topics:

- A Home page that provides a brief and general introduction to the Arizona Board of Physical Therapy complete with contact information and a link to the official State of Arizona web-site;
- A Board Members and Board Meetings page that features the names and a photograph of the Board members, the names and titles of Board staff, and some general information about the meetings of the Board, such as tentative dates and instructions on how to request Board meeting agendas;
- The Arizona Practice Act and Administrative Rules page provides quick links to A.R.S. Title 32, Chapter 19, Board of Physical Therapy (the Arizona Revised Statutes that govern the practice of physical therapy) and to A.A.C. Title 4, Chapter 24, Board of Physical Therapy (the sections of the Arizona Administrative Code that correspond to the Board's statutes);
- A Licensing and Applications page allows interested applicants to view the application requirements appropriate to their particular situation as well as to actually download all the application packet materials, and includes a listing of application fees and dates on which the Board will substantively review applications for licensure and certification;
- A Complaints and Investigations page addresses the Board's authority to investigate and review complaints and to take disciplinary action against licensees or certificate holders who violate the Board's statutes or rules, and offers some guidance in terms of filing a complaint;
- The Continuing Competence page provides an overview of requirements for Arizona licensed physical therapists with links to the section of the Arizona Administrative Code that prescribes the requirements;

- Our Newsletters page offers the most recent 2 newsletter issues for web viewing with subsequent issues to be added as they are published;
- A Directory of Related Links allows the reader to jump to the web-sites for the Arizona State Legislature, the APTA and AzPTA, the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT), and to the three Arizona Board-approved credential evaluation agencies for foreign educated physical therapists.

As with any web-site, the site for the Arizona Board of Physical Therapy will continue to evolve with respect to offering additional information and including more interactive features. By the end of January 2003, the site will feature a searchable data-base of PTs and PTAs so that members of the public, employers, insurance providers, credential evaluators and any other interested individuals may search for specific physical therapists or physical therapist assistants by name or by license number. The search will return the name, license/certificate number and type, active/inactive status and issue/expiration date of a PT license/PTA certificate if that individual is or has been licensed or certified by the Board. The address and telephone number of public record will not be returned but will be provided upon request. If a licensee or certificate holder has ever had a complaint filed against him or her, the search report will advise the inquirer to contact the Board for additional information. In the future, the site may also be used to post Board meeting agendas and minutes, link to substantive policy statements issued by the Board, view Board-issued reports and publications and otherwise inform the public and members of the profession regarding the practice of physical therapy in Arizona.

Continuing Competence in Review

For the 1st time in Arizona physical therapists reported continuing competence activities as a requirement for renewal of license in 2002. This was a challenging time for physical therapists, Board members and staff as we all prepared for continuing competence reporting and auditing to be in compliance with the law and rules concerning this mandatory renewal requirement.

The Board and staff spent months preparing for this reporting and auditing process. A Board appointed Continuing Competence Task Force met with staff to develop audit procedures, an audit reporting form and a timetable for the actual audit process, all of which were approved by the Board at a public meeting. 30 days following the renewal deadline of August 31, 2002 a random selection of 5% of Arizona licensed physical therapists received an audit notification letter along with instructions and a reporting form to be submitted to the Board for auditing. In December, a 7 member Continuing Competence Audit Committee, appointed by the Board, reviewed the audit submissions for compliance with the rules.

A total of 126 files were reviewed, of which 18 licensees were found to be out of compliance with the requirements and an additional 6 failed to attempt to comply with the requirements. Not included in this 1st round of audits were the 43 physical therapists who renewed their licenses after the August 31st deadline, all of whom will be audited for compliance. Every file was reviewed initially by 2 or 3 member teams of Audit Committee members. These files were spot-checked by staff to ensure consistency and accuracy. All files that were identified as out of compliance were reviewed by a second team of 2 or 3 Audit Committee members, and any disagreement between the initial and 2nd review teams were reviewed and discussed by the entire Committee until a final recommendation of compliance or non-compliance was made.

Of the licensees determined to be out of compliance there was great consistency in the reasons why their files were


determined to be out of compliance. Almost all of these individuals lacked the required minimum of 10 hours in Category A activities, either because the course documentation did not reflect Category A approval or because there was inadequate documentation to determine the correct category for the activity. A few of the files reflected sufficient Category A activities but insufficient clinical content to fulfill the minimum requirement of no more than 5 hours of non-clinical activities in Category A, or a total of 5 non-clinical hours from Categories B and C combined. Some licensees had copious hours of continuing competence education but did not have sufficient hours to meet the requirement in Category A.

Pursuant to the rules, A.A.C. R4-24-401(J), licensees found not in compliance have 6 months from the notice of non-compliance to satisfy the continuing competence requirements for renewal of license. Many licensees will simply need to contact the course sponsor or approval organization to obtain documentation to support their reported activities as Category A. Some licensees will need to complete additional coursework to fulfill the requirement for the 2000-2002 compliance period.

To prepare for the continuing competence requirement for the compliance period 2002-2004, licensees should ensure that their documentation for continuing competence activities includes a course schedule to substantiate hours spent in the course, and some documentation to substantiate that the contact hours for continuing education courses were approved by a Category A organization. Category A approval organizations include PT, medical or health care accredited schools, national or state associations or national specialty societies. Other state's licensing boards do not qualify as Category A approval organizations. Physical therapists who are licensed between September 1, 2002 and August 31, 2003 will be required to obtain only 10 contact hours of continuing competence activities, all of which must be from Category A, rather than the full 20 hour requirement.

Board Staff Appointments

Two members of the Board's staff have recently been appointed to committees of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT). Heidi Herbst Paakkonen, Executive Director, has been appointed by the FSBPT Board for a 2 year term on the FSBPT Finance Committee. Peg Hiller, Investigator, has been appointed for a 2 year term on the FSBPT Ethics and Legislation Committee. Both Heidi and Peg are honored to serve on these committees and to further the work of the FSBPT.



Board of PT Enforcement Activities

The following is an explanation of the actions the Board may take when adjudicating a complaint:

Non-disciplinary actions:

If the Board finds that the information received in a complaint or an investigation is not of sufficient seriousness to merit direct action against the licensee or certificate holder it may take either of the following actions (A.R.S. §32-2045):

- Dismiss the complaint if it is without merit.
- File a letter of concern, which may be used in future disciplinary actions against a licensee or certificate holder.

Disciplinary actions:

If at an informal interview the Board finds a violation that constitutes grounds for disciplinary action, it may take the following actions (A.R.S. §32-2046 and 2047):

- Issue a decree of censure, which is an official reprimand against a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant.

All Board actions are taken in public session. Contact the Board office for public complaint records.

- Place a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant on probation. The Board can prescribe a licensee's or certificate holder's scope or place of practice, supervision of practice, or the type or condition of patient or client served.

If the results of an informal interview indicate that more serious action might be in order, the Board will refer the matter to a formal hearing (A.R.S. §32-2046 and 2047) to consider the following actions:

- Suspend a license or certificate for a period prescribed by the Board.
- Revoke a license or certificate.
- Refuse to issue or renew a license or certificate.
- Impose a civil penalty of at least \$250 dollars but not more than \$10,000 for each violation of the law.
- Accept a voluntary surrendering of a license or certificate.

BOARD ACTIONS 2002

The Board opened 25 complaints in 2002 and took action on 3 complaints opened in 2001. Of the complaints opened in 2002, 11 complaints remained open at the end of 2002 awaiting Board action, 11 complaints were dismissed with no violation of statute or rules, 2 complaints resulted in the Board issuing Letters of Concern, and 1 complaint resulted in the licensee being found in violation of statute and placed on probation. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2003(14), the following is a listing of actions taken by the Board January 2002— December 2002:

The continuation of these practices may result in action against the PT or PTA. A letter of concern is a public document and may be used in future disciplinary actions against the PT or PTA.

In addition, the Board opened 9 Unlawful Practice Investigations against PT's who did not renew their licenses by the September 1, 2002 deadline and who continued to practice while their license was lapsed. These licensees have all been placed on probation, assessed fines, required to write interpretive essays of statute and required to perform community service. The following physical therapists were found in violation of A.R.S. § 32-2048: Robert Cook (5701), Timothy Cousins, Jr. (5211), Gayle Haas (1817), Scott Myers (5830), Elisa Passaro (4190), Stuart Rothschild (5789), Mary Ruckman (3624), and Daniel Williams (4120). Steven Smart (5069) practiced unlawfully for only 2 days and was placed on probation and assessed a fine.
